



An Interview with Bryan Page

Our District Grand Prefect recently called in to see one of our senior members, Bryan Page, to catch up on how he is and to get his thoughts on the Allied Masonic Degrees. Bryan said:

I first became aware of the Allied Masonic Degree by over hearing brethren speaking about it and reading books about Masonry. Eventually the opportunity arose to seek membership, which I accepted and was duly admitted into the Londinium Council No 47 on the 15th of December 1977. We were 3 candidates in number, one was Harold Gould, who has risen to high positions in this and other Masonic orders and served as District Grand Prefect of Southern Counties, which was subsequently divided into Surrey, Sussex and Southern Counties. The other so far as I know, we didn't see again!


My proposer was Francis J Stokes and seconder was Howard A Stokes, both were notable Masons in London and Surrey at the time. I advanced to the Chair (I think for 2 years) followed by a good many years as D.C. While I was on the staff at Freemasons Hall, I became a founder of The Brigadier Gallway Council No 126, served as W.M. and am now an Honorary Member.

I joined Surrey as a founder of Kyngstun Council No 102 and was later a founder of Southern Cross Council X111. I have very much enjoyed my time in the Surrey Allied as well as the opportunities that I have had during my time as a Surrey Allied Mason.

With having 5 degrees the Allied Masonic Degrees was of great interest to me and as such wanting to find out more and thereby further my Masonic knowledge. I have always found the Allied not only very interesting but also very rewarding. The 5 degrees made it both special and different.

Fortunately, I have been OK throughout the Pandemic, albeit have not been able to attend any meetings because I am not very stable on my feet at the moment. Thinking ahead, I believe that Retention is of paramount importance, as well as encouraging the members to get back to attending and enjoying our regular meetings.

The variety of the 5 degrees in the Allied should be a great incentive for any potential new members to join our Order. I would encourage any Mark Master Mason to join this very interesting order but do it in a sensible way without stretching yourself by ensuring you have the time available to commit to your preferred council. When the time is right talk to the senior members in the Order as I am sure you will receive all the help, support and advice that may be needed. Be sure that you have enough time to commit to the order not only to attend the regular meetings but it's also important to understand the various degrees so as to be an asset to your council and a good mentor for future members.
